BACKGROUND:

The City previously received a grant award from FEMA in the total amount of \$293,191.00 with a total cost match of \$29,319.00 for a total of \$322,510.00. **AGREEMENT TO FURNISH ENGINEERING SERVICES
TO THE CITY OF SAPULPA**

This Agreement made this 22nd day of Nov, 2019, between the firm of McClelland Consulting Engineers, Inc., hereinafter referred to as the ENGINEER, and the City of Sapulpa, Oklahoma, hereinafter referred to as the OWNER, wherein the ENGINEER agrees to provide certain services as defined in Article 1 and for the consideration in Article 2 herein.

ARTICLE 1

The OWNER has selected the ENGINEER to assist with certain Engineering Services and may select the ENGINEER for future services.

These services, when requested by the OWNER, will be described in specific Work Orders which become a part of this agreement upon execution. The ENGINEER agrees to perform the services described in the Work Orders after execution by both parties to the Agreement.

ARTICLE 2

The compensation for services to be provided will be negotiated and specified in each Work Order.

ARTICLE 3

Payment to the ENGINEER for services provided as described in Article 1 is to be made within 30 days after date of billing. The amount due will be for services rendered during the previous month based on the percentage of completion or actual costs, as appropriate.

ARTICLE 4

It is further mutually agreed by the parties hereto:

- 4.1 That the OWNER will designate a single representative to direct and coordinate the ENGINEER's efforts and who will be the only source of instructions to the ENGINEER and who shall have the authority to interpret the OWNER's policy as necessary to maintain the ENGINEER's work schedule, administer the Agreement, and certify the ENGINEER's payment requests.

- 4.2 That the OWNER shall make available to the ENGINEER all technical data in the OWNER's possession, including laboratory tests, maps, surveys, borings, and other information required by the ENGINEER and relating to ENGINEER's work.
- 4.3 That the OWNER will provide staff assistance in locating utilities & appurtenances and will uncover utilities (such as manholes) as necessary to provide access.
- 4.4 That the estimates of cost for the Project provided for herein are to be prepared by the ENGINEER through exercise of his experience and judgement in applying presently available cost data, but it is recognized that the ENGINEER has no control over cost of labor and materials conditions, so that he cannot warrant that the Project construction cost will not vary from his cost estimate.
- 4.5 It is anticipated that most of the work orders will be completed on a Lump Sum basis, percent of construction cost, or standard hourly rate plus direct expense basis. However, for work completed on cost reimbursement plus direct expense basis will be calculated as follows: That the ENGINEER'S Salary Overheads are defined as a percentage of wages or salaries of employees working and premiums measured by or applicable at the time of performance to such wages or salaries, such as but not limited to, Worker's Compensation Insurance, Social Security, State and Federal Unemployment Insurance, medical-hospital insurance, pension plan costs, and pro rata allowances for vacation, sick pay, and holiday pay. Profit is to be 15% of cost. The overall multiplier is 3.3 x direct labor.

That the ENGINEER's direct expenses are defined as the costs incurred on or directly for the Project, other than the Salary and General Overhead Costs, as defined hereinbefore. Such direct expenses shall be computed on the basis of actual purchase price for items obtained from commercial sources and on the basis of usual commercial charges for items provided by the ENGINEER.

Direct expenses shall include, but not be limited to, necessary transportation costs, including mileage at the ENGINEER's current rate per mile when the ENGINEER's own automobiles are used; meals and lodging; laboratory tests and analyses; computer services; word processing services; telephone; and printing and binding charges, and subconsultant charges.

- 4.6 That if payment of the amount due as prescribed in Article 2, or any portion thereof, is not made within the period specified in Article 3, interest on the unpaid balance thereof will accrue at the rate of 10 percent per annum and become due and payable at the time said overdue payments are made.
- 4.7 That the ENGINEER shall maintain a level of competency presently maintained by other practicing professional engineers in the same type of work for the professional and technical soundness and accuracy of all designs, drawings, specifications, and other work and materials furnished under this Agreement.

- 4.8 That either party may terminate this Agreement at any time by a notice in writing to the other party. If the Agreement is terminated as provided herein, the ENGINEER will be paid for services actually performed; the amount of said payment shall bear the same ratio to the total compensation specified as the services actually performed bear to the total services of the ENGINEER, less payments of compensation previously made.
- 4.9 That the OWNER may, from time to time, request changes in the scope of the services of the ENGINEER to be performed hereunder. Such changes, including any increase or decrease in the amount of the ENGINEER's compensation, which are mutually agreed upon by and between the OWNER and the ENGINEER, shall be incorporated in written amendments to this Agreement, and will be paid in accordance with paragraph 4.5 above.
- 4.10 That unless otherwise stated in a Work Order the OWNER shall pay for all costs of publishing advertisements for bids; for obtaining drawing reviews, permits, and licenses that may be required by local, state, or federal authorities; and shall pay for and secure the necessary land, easements, and rights-of-way as described by the ENGINEER or local surveyor.
- 4.11 That all claims, counter-claims, disputes and other matters in question between the OWNER and the ENGINEER arising out of or relating to this Agreement or in the breach thereof, will be decided by binding arbitration only if both parties hereto specifically agree to the use of arbitration in regard to the individual matter in dispute. The total liability, in the aggregate, of ENGINEER and ENGINEER'S Officers, Directors, Employees, Agents and Independent Professional Associates and Consultants, and any of them to OWNER and anyone claiming by, through or under OWNER, for any and all injuries, claims, losses, expenses or damages whatsoever arising out of or in any way related to ENGINEER'S services, the project or this agreement from any cause or causes whatsoever, including but not limited to the negligence, errors, omissions, strict liability or breach of contract of ENGINEER or ENGINEER'S Officers, Directors, Employees, Agents or Independent Professional Associates or Consultants, or any of them, shall not exceed the total errors and omissions insurance coverage of \$1,000,000.
- 4.12 That, in the event of any legal or other controversy requiring the services of the ENGINEER in providing expert testimony in connection with the Project, except suits or claims by third parties against the OWNER arising out of errors or omissions of the ENGINEER, the OWNER shall pay the ENGINEER for services rendered in regard to such legal or other controversy on a basis to be negotiated.

That the OWNER will pay the ENGINEER for labor and expenses incurred in satisfying the requirements and assisting in any audit required by the OWNER or any of their duly authorized representatives. The basis of payment will be specified in an Amendment to this Agreement.

4.13 That visits to a construction site and observations made by the ENGINEER as part of his services shall not relieve the construction contractor(s) of his obligation to conduct comprehensive inspections of this work sufficient to ensure conformance with the intent of the Contract Documents, and shall not relieve the construction contractor(s) of his responsibility for all construction means, methods, techniques, sequences, and procedures necessary for coordinating and completing all work under the construction contract(s) and for all safety precautions incidental thereto. Such visits by the ENGINEER are not to be construed as part of the observation duties of on-site observation personnel.

4.14 That the ENGINEER shall provide on-site observation personnel as required if directed by Work Order, and will make reasonable efforts to guard the OWNER against defects and deficiencies in the work of the contractor(s) and to help determine if the construction contract(s) has been fulfilled.

Their day-to-day observation will not, however, cause the ENGINEER to be responsible for those duties and responsibilities which belong to the construction contractor(s) and which include, but are not limited to, full responsibility for the techniques and sequences of construction and the safety precautions incidental thereto, and for performing the construction work in accordance with Contract Documents.

4.15 That the ENGINEER has the right to subcontract services; however, the OWNER has the right to approve subcontractors who perform work on the Project in excess of \$10,000.

4.16 All Tracings, Specifications, and computer disks prepared or furnished by ENGINEER (and ENGINEER'S independent professional associates and consultants) pursuant to this Agreement are instruments of service in respect of the Project and ENGINEER shall retain an ownership and property interest therein whether or not the Project is completed. OWNER may make at his cost and retain copies for information and reference in connection with the use and occupancy of the Project by OWNER and others; however, such documents are not intended or represented to be suitable for reuse by OWNER or others on extensions of the Project or on any other project. Any reuse without written verification or adaptation by ENGINEER for the specific purpose intended will be at OWNER'S sole risk and without liability or legal exposure to ENGINEER, or to ENGINEER'S independent professional associates or consultants, and OWNER shall indemnify and hold harmless ENGINEER and ENGINEER'S independent professional associates and consultants from all claims, damages, losses, and expenses including attorney's fees arising out of or resulting therefrom. Any such verification or adaptation will entitle ENGINEER to further compensation at rates to be agreed upon by OWNER and ENGINEER.

4.17 That this Agreement is to be binding on the heirs, successors, and assigns of the parties hereto and is not to be assigned by either party without first obtaining the written consent of the other.

ARTICLE 5
